

# Alpine County Vote by Mail

Greetings! The County Clerk's Office mailed official election ballots on October 5, 2020 to all active Alpine County Voters. Although current media has negatively portrayed vote by mail, Alpine County is no stranger to voting by mail. We have successfully voted by mail since the 1980's, and have repeatedly vied for the largest voter turnout in the State.

New this year is the Ballot Drop Box, located at the Administration Building, 99 Water Street, Markleeville, CA. The Ballot Drop Box can be accessed 24 hours a day through Election Day, November 3, 2020.

Even though the County offices remain closed to public access, we are still available to assist voters by email and telephone.

Voters still have the option to vote in-person on Election Day from 7am to 8pm, the County Clerk's staff will be onsite and available to assist voters.

The County Clerk's Office, in collaboration with the Woodfords Community Council, will hold a voter registration drive at the Hung-A-Lel-Ti Community Education Center on October 12, 2020 from 5:30pm to 8:00pm.
