State Officials Announce Latest COVID-19 Facts

Greater Sacramento Region Exits Regional Stay at Home Order Today Based on ICU Projections

SACRAMENTO – Today, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) released the most recent statistics on COVID-19, including data on intensive care unit (ICU) capacity across the state.

Based on four-week ICU projections, the Greater Sacramento region can immediately exit the Regional Stay at Home Order. Counties within that region will return to the tiering system and rules under the [Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#).
